Career

- In 2007, did not compete until August due to a skiing accident in December 2006, which required surgery to repair her ACL.
- In 2006, posted a career-best finish with a tie for fifth at the SBS Open at Turtle Bay; tied her career-low 66 in the second round of the Fields Open in Hawaii.
- In 2005, best finish was a tie for sixth at the John Q. Hammons Hotel Classic.
- In 2004, tied her career-low 66 during the first round of the Longs Drugs Challenge; recorded her season-best finish at the LPGA Takefujii Classic and the ShopRite LPGA Classic, tying for 27th at both events.
- In 2003, best finish was a tie for 10th at the John Q. Hammons Hotel Classic; also tied for 11th at the ShopRite LPGA Classic; carded a career-low 66 in the second round of the Jamie Farr Kroger Classic Presented by ALLTEL.
- In 2002, won the Grand Rapids Futures Classic and the Capital Region Futures Classic on the Futures Tour; earned exempt status for the 2003 LPGA Tour season by virtue of her third-place finish on the Futures Tour season-ending money list.
- In 2001, turned professional in March and began competing on the Futures Tour, where she recorded 10 top-10 finishes and finished 10th on the Futures Tour money list; qualified for the LPGA Tour by tying for 31st at the LPGA Final Qualifying Tournament to earn non-exempt status for the 2002 LPGA season.

Amateur

Nagl, who lived in Germany from ages 8-16, recorded several victories in the German Junior Championships and was the runner-up at the British Girl Championship from 1997-99. She was a runner-up at the World Team Amateur Championship in 1998. She played on the American Junior Golf Association (AJGA) circuit and won the first tournament she entered. While attending Arizona State University, she won the 1999 NCAA Fall Preview and the 2000 NCAA West Regional. She was named the 2000 NCAA Freshman of the Year and was a First-Team All-American in 2000.
