Professional

Career

- In 2008, competed in 12 events on the Duramed FUTURES Tour, and tied for sixth at the Bright House Networks Open; returned to the LPGA Final Qualifying Tournament, where she tied for 29th to earn Priority List Category 20 for the 2009 LPGA season.
- In 2006, posted a career-low 69 in the second round of the Fields Open in Hawaii and in the opening round of the Florida's Natural Charity Championship hosted by Nancy Lopez; was limited to only nine events due to a hand injury.
- In 2005, played in three Futures Tour events, with a season-best tie for 14th at the Lawrence FUTURES Golf Classic; tied for 22nd at the LPGA Final Qualifying Tournament Presented by American Airlines and earned one of the final three exempt cards for the 2006 season after a three-hole, seven-way playoff.
- In 2004, competed in three Futures Tour events.
- In 2003, turned professional in November.

Amateur

Cano was the San Antonio City Women's Amateur Champion from 1999-2003. In 1999, she was named the San Antonio Sportswoman of the Year. While at Oklahoma State University, Cano was an NCAA Honorable Mention All-American in 2002 and also a Big 12 First-Team All-Conference selection that same season. Cano was selected as a member of the U.S. Team for the 2002 Fuji-Xerox Collegiate Championship, a match play event featuring the USA versus Japan.
