- Recorded her first LPGA career hole-in-one in the first round of the LPGA State Farm Classic.

Career

- In 2008, recorded a career-best tie for seventh at the Bell Micro LPGA Classic; carded a career-low 66 in the final round of the Stanford International Pro-Am, where she finished tied for 14th; returned to LPGA Final Qualifying Tournament, where she finished ninth to earn Priority List Category 11 for the 2009 LPGA season.
- In 2007, won the Hunters Oak Golf Classic and recorded eight additional top-10 finishes, including six top-five finishes in 14 events on the Duramed FUTURES Tour; placed third on the Duramed FUTURES Tour season-ending money list to earn exempt status for the 2008 LPGA season.
- In 2006, played in 19 events on the Duramed FUTURES Tour, with four top-10 finishes, including a win at the Team WLF.org Golf Classic and a second-place finish at the Lima Memorial Hospital FUTURES Classic; tied for 28th at the LPGA Final Qualifying Tournament to earn non-exempt status for the 2007 LPGA season.
- In 2005, played in 17 events on the Futures Tour, with four top-10 finishes.
- In 2004, turned professional in July.

Amateur

Fankhauser recorded four top-10 finishes on the American Junior Golf Association (AJGA) circuit and earned honorable mention AJGA All-American honors in 1998. She competed in four U.S. Women's Amateur Championships (1999-2002) and was a quarterfinalist in 2002. She was a member of the 2002 U.S. Curtis Cup Team. While at The Ohio State University, Fankhauser won six collegiate tournaments. The 2001 Big Ten Conference Player of the Year, Fankhauser was a two-time NCAA Second-

Team All-American selection (2001-02) and a two-time medalist at the Big Ten Conference Championship (2001-02).
