Professional

Career

- In 2008, named to the Advisory Board of the Southern California PGA Foundation.
- Served as host of the Office Depot Championship Hosted by Amy Alcott from 2001-04.
- In 2002, recorded her season-best finish at the Kellogg-Keebler Classic, where she tied for 21st.
- In 2001, carded her fifth LPGA career hole-in-one during the second round of the Standard Register PING.
- In 2000, best finish was a tie for 17th at the Giant Eagle LPGA Classic.
- In 1999, became the 15th player inducted into the LPGA Tour and World Golf Halls of Fame; best finish was a tie for 29th at the Valley of the Stars Championship.
- In 1998, best finish was a tie for seventh at the Jamie Farr Kroger Classic.
- In 1997, returned to competition in March; best finish came at the ShopRite LPGA Classic, where she tied for 29th.
- In 1996, posted a season-best tie for second place at the Weetabix Women's British Open; suffered a broken knee cap in December.
- In 1995, best finish was a tie for fifth at the PING/Welch's Championship in Tucson, Ariz.; recorded her fourth LPGA career hole-in-one during the second round of the ShopRite LPGA Classic.
- In 1994, finished fourth at the Minnesota LPGA Classic and also crossed the \$3 million mark in career earnings at the JAL Big Apple Classic.
- In 1993, tied for sixth at the State Farm Rail Classic.
- In 1992, had four top-10 finishes, including ties for eighth at both the Las Vegas LPGA International and ShopRite LPGA Classic.
- In 1991, won the Nabisco Dinah Shore for the third time in her career and began the tradition of jumping into the 18th-greenside lake; recorded her third LPGA career hole-in-one at The Phar-Mor at Inverrary.
- In 1990, finished second at the Rochester International.
- In 1989, recorded six top-10 finishes, including a victory at the Boston Five Classic.
- In 1988, her first-place paycheck at the Nabisco Dinah Shore enabled her to become the LPGA's third member to surpass the \$2 mark million in career earnings.
- In 1987, placed second at the Konica San Jose Classic and tied for second at the Rochester International.
- In 1986, won the Mazda Hall of Fame Championship in a sudden-death playoff with Lauren Howe, and the LPGA National Pro-Am, which extended her perennial win streak to 12 seasons; lost to Patty Sheehan in a two-hole sudden-death playoff at the Konica San Jose Classic; won the Mazda Champions with Bob Charles.
- In 1985, won three titles: Circle K Tucson Open; Moss Creek Women's Invitational; and Nestle World Championship of Women's Golf, where she defeated Patty Sheehan in a two-hole sudden-death playoff; lost to Pat Bradley in a two-hole sudden-death playoff at the LPGA National Pro-Am.
- In 1984, posted her third season of four tournament victories (also 1979-80).
- In 1983, captured her third major championship victory with a win at the Nabisco Dinah Shore Invitational; became the sixth LPGA millionaire, cresting the \$1 million mark at the Chrysler-Plymouth Classic; recorded the second LPGA hole-in-one of her career at the Inamori Classic.
- In 1982, won the Women's Kemper Open and posted 13 additional top-10 finishes; won the Mitsukoshi Ladies Japan Open on the Japan LPGA Tour.
- In 1981, won two tournaments: the Bent Tree Classic and Lady Michelob; came close to successfully defending her Inamori Classic title, but lost in a sudden-death playoff to Hollis Stacy; was the individual winner in the Pioneer Cup Matches for her first of two international victories; won the Mr. Goodwrench Invitational with Larry Nelson.
- In 1980, captured four more titles, including her first U.S. Women's Open; finished second at the CPC International after a sudden-death playoff with Hollis Stacy; won the Vare Trophy.
- In 1979, her first major championship win came at the Peter Jackson Classic; also won three other titles that season, including a three-hole sudden-death playoff victory over Sandra Post at the Elizabeth Arden Classic.
- In 1978, defeated Hollis Stacy in a sudden-death playoff at the American Defender Classic for the first of her four career playoff victories.
- In 1977, won the Houston Exchange Clubs Classic and posted 11 top-10 finishes.
- In 1976, recorded the first of seven multiple-win seasons with victories at the LPGA Classic and Colgate Far East Open.

- In 1975, originally qualified for the LPGA Tour at the LPGA Final Qualifying Tournament in January, where she tied for 12th; captured her first LPGA victory in only her third tournament as a professional at the Orange Blossom Classic; lost in a sudden-death playoff to Sandra Haynie later that season at the Charity Golf Classic; won Rookie of the Year honors.

Amateur

Alcott's short amateur career was highlighted by her 1973 win at the U.S. Girls' Junior Championship at the age of 17.
