Professional

Career

- In 2009, best finish was a tie for 18th at the LPGA State Farm Classic; crossed the \$1 million mark in career earnings at the P&G Beauty NW Arkansas Championship Presented by John Q. Hammons, where she tied for 27th.
- In 2007, recorded a season-best tie for seventh at the LPGA State Farm Classic; recorded her second LPGA career hole-in-one at the Hana Bank • KOLON Championship 2007.
- In 2006, became a Rolex First-Time Winner after defeating Lorena Ochoa and Soo Young Moon in a two-hole, sudden-death playoff at the SBS Open at Turtle Bay, where she tied her career-low 65 during the second round; recorded her first LPGA career hole-in-one at the Safeway International Presented by Coca-Cola.
- In 2005, best finish was fourth place at the Safeway Classic Presented by Pepsi; tied for fifth at the Sybase Classic presented by Lincoln Mercury, where she carded a career-low 65 during the second round.
- In 2004, played on the Korea LPGA Tour (KLPGA) and repeated as the Hansol Ladies Open champion; tied for 12th at the LPGA Final Qualifying Tournament to earn exempt status for the 2005 LPGA season.
- In 2003, played on the KLPGA and won the Hansol Ladies Open and the Woori Jeung Kwan Classic for her first two international victories.
- In 2002, turned professional in November.

Amateur

Kim finished second in the 2000 World Amateur Championship and placed third at the U.S. Women's Amateur Championship. She was a member of the 1999-2002 Korean National Team and won a gold medal in the 2002 Asian Games.
