**2008**

- Carded a season-low 71 in the second round of the Safeway Classic Presented by Pepsi.

**Career**

- In 2007, best finish was a tie for 10th at the Michelob ULTRA Open at Kingsmill.
- In 2006, best finish was a tie for 15th at the MasterCard Classic Honoring Alejo Peralta.
- In 2005, carded a career-low 65 in the first round of the Safeway International Presented by Coca-Cola, where she tied for 12th; tied for fourth at the Phuket Thailand Ladies Masters, which is organized by the Thailand Ladies' Golf Association.
- In 2004, enjoyed the best season of her career with \$177,377 in earnings, more money than she had earned in five previous seasons combined; recorded a career-best tie for second at the Kellogg-Keebler Classic; recorded the first hole-in-one of her LPGA career during the second round of the Longs Drugs Challenge.
- In 2003, best finish was a tie for 24th at the Wendy's Championship for Children at Tartan Fields; returned to the LPGA Final Qualifying Tournament, where she tied for 22nd and earned exempt status for the 2004 LPGA season via an eight-way, three-hole playoff.
- In 2001, best finish was a tie for 17th at the Electrolux USA Championship Hosted by Vince Gill and Amy Grant; returned to the LPGA Final Qualifying Tournament and tied for 10th to earn exempt status for the 2002 LPGA season.
- In 2000, competed on the Futures Tour, where she won the Carolina National Futures Classic; returned to the LPGA Final Qualifying Tournament and tied for 18th to gain non-exempt status for the 2001 LPGA season.

- In 1999, recorded a tie for 30th at the Japan Airlines Big Apple Classic; returned to the LPGA Final Qualifying Tournament and tied for 51st to retain non-exempt status for the 2000 LPGA season.
- In 1998, tied for 58th at the LPGA Final Qualifying Tournament to earn non-exempt status for the 1999 LPGA season.
- From 1997-98, competed on both the Futures Tour and the Asian Tour.
- In 1996, turned professional.

#### Amateur

Lim won the Thailand Ladies Amateur Championship in 1992 and captured the Malaysian Ladies Amateur title in 1992 and 1994. She played collegiate golf at the University of South Carolina where, in 1995, Lim won All-America honors and was named Southeastern Conference (SEC) Player of the Year.
