Professional

2010

- Became the first player since 1966 to win consecutive season-opening events with the Honda PTT LPGA Thailand, where she won by one stroke over Suzann Pettersen with a career-low and tournament-record 63 in the final round and the HSBC Women's Champions; also won the Tres Marias Championship, ShopRite Classic and Safeway Classic Presented by Coca-Cola. Finished tied for third at the LPGA Championship Presented by Wegmans; tied for ninth at the RICOH Women's Open and the P&G NW Arkansas Championship Presented by Walmart; tied for 15th at the CN Canadian Women's Open; tied for 19th at the Evian Masters Presented by Société Générale; tied for 27th at the Navistar LPGA Classic Presented by Monaco RV; tied for 28th at the Sime Darby LPGA Malaysia and tied for 31st at the U.S. Women's Open.

Career

- In 2009, became a Rolex First-Time Winner at the Evian Masters Presented by Societe Generale, where she defeated Sophie Gustafson in a one-hole, sudden-death playoff; finished second at the Samsung World Championship and tied for second at the CN Canadian Women's Open; tied for third at the RICOH Women's British Open, tying her career-best finish at a major championship; other top-10 finishes include a tie for fourth at the Safeway Classic Presented by Coca-Cola; ties for fifth at the season-opening SBS Open at Turtle Bay and LPGA Corning Classic; ties for sixth at the LPGA State Farm Classic, where she crossed the \$2 million mark in career earnings, and the U.S. Women's Open; a tie for eighth at the LPGA Tour Championship Presented by Rolex; a tie for ninth at the J Golf Phoenix LPGA International Presented by Mirrasou Winery and a ninth-place finish at the Michelob ULTRA Open at Kingsmill, and a tie for 10th at the P&G Beauty NW Arkansas Championship Presented by John Q. Hammons, where she crossed the \$3 million mark in career earnings.
- In 2008, recorded three top-10 finishes: a tie for fourth at the P&G Beauty NW Arkansas Championship Presented by John Q. Hammons, a tie for fifth at the RICOH Women's British Open and a tie for sixth at the Wegmans LPGA.
- In 2007, recorded six top-10 finishes, including a second-place finish at the HSBC Women's World Match Play Championship, where she lost to Seon Hwa Lee in the championship match; crossed the \$1 million mark in career earnings.

- In 2006, recorded seven top-10 finishes, including a season-best tie for third at the McDonald's LPGA Championship Presented by Coca-Cola; won two events on the JLPGA circuit.
- In 2005, won six events on the JLPGA, including the Japan Women's Open Golf Championship; competed in six LPGA events and tied for ninth at the HSBC Women's World Match Play Championship; tied for 10th at the Mizuno Classic and tied for 11th at the Weetabix Women's British Open; partnered with Rui Kitada to win the inaugural Women's World Cup of Golf, an unofficial LPGA event; won the LPGA Final Qualifying Tournament by a record 12 strokes to earn her exempt card for the 2006 LPGA season.
- In 2004, won five events on the JLPGA; played in two LPGA events, tying for second at the Mizuno Classic and carded a career-low 63 in the final round.
- In 2003, turned professional in October and competed on the JLPGA.

Amateur

Miyazato's amateur career was capped with a victory at the 2003 Miyagi TV Dunlop Ladies Golf Tournament – a professional event on the JLPGA – when she was a senior in high school. She also won the 2003 Japan Junior Golf Championship and the Japan Women's Amateur Golf Championship.
