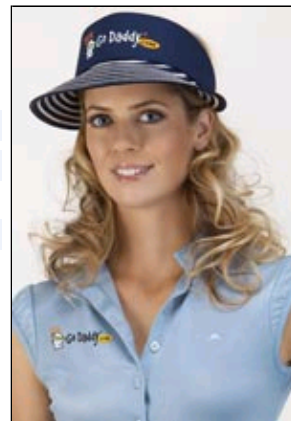

Professional

Career

- In 2009, best finish was a tie for 13th at the LPGA State Farm Classic; carded a career-low 64 (-7) in the opening round of the CN Canadian Women's Open, where she tied for 18th.
- In 2008, recorded a career-best tie for 10th at the Bell Micro LPGA Classic; competed on the Ladies European Tour (LET), where her season-best finish was sixth at the Finnair Masters; returned to the LPGA Final Qualifying Tournament, where she tied for 12th to earn Priority List Category 11 for the 2009 LPGA season.
- In 2007, competed on the LET and finished second at the Deutsche Bank Ladies Swiss Open, where she lost to Bettina Hauert on the fourth hole of a sudden-death playoff; tied for 18th at the LPGA Final Qualifying Tournament to earn non-exempt status for the 2008 LPGA season.
- In 2006, competed on the LET and finished 10th at the Deutsche Bank Ladies Swiss Open.
- In 2005, competed on the Duramed FUTURES Tour, where she recorded two top-10 finishes in 17 events.
- In 2004, turned professional in August.

Amateur

Rawson was the medalist at the Australian Amateur Championship in 1999 and 2000. In 1999, she won the Jack Newton Junior Invitational, the South Australian Junior Championship and the Victorian Junior Championship. Rawson earned All-Pac-10 honorable mention honors in 2001 while at the University of Southern California and was a member of the 2003 NCAA Championship team.
