Professional

Career

- In 2008, carded a season-low 71 in the second round of the LPGA Corning Classic.
- In 2007, did not play due to the birth of her son Jay Marshall Brooker in January.
- From 2003-05, competed on the Ladies European Tour (LET) full time, where her best finish was a tie for 11th at the 2003 La Perla Italian Open; returned to the LPGA Final Qualifying Tournament in 2005 and tied for 47th to earn non-exempt status for the 2006 LPGA season.
- In 2002, carded her third LPGA career hole-in-one during the first round of the Chick-fil-A Charity Championship hosted by Nancy Lopez.
- In 2001, best finish was a tie for 27th at the season-opening YourLife Vitamins LPGA Classic.
- In 2000, crossed the \$1 million mark in career earnings with her season-best tie for third at the Philips Invitational Honoring Harvey Penick; shot a career-low 64 during the third round of the Evian Masters; carded her second LPGA career hole-in-one

during the first round of the Subaru Memorial of Naples.

- In 1999, best finish was a tie for sixth at the Longs Drugs Challenge.
- In 1998, season-best finish was a tie for fourth at the State Farm Rail Classic.
- In 1997, best finish was a tie for third at the Oldsmobile Classic; carded the first hole-in-one of her LPGA career during the first round of the U.S. Women's Open.
- In 1996, season-best finish was a tie for fifth at the Toray Japan Queens Cup.
- In 1995, won the year-end Paul Arpin Van Lines Move of the Month award for making the greatest move up the money list in one week (100 places); recorded a career-best finish with a second place at the Nabisco Dinah Shore, one of the Tour's four major championships; weeks later, Redman's son, Bo Jess, was diagnosed with neuroblastoma, a childhood form of cancer (he is currently in remission and doing well).
- In 1994, best finish was a tie for 12th at the SAFECO Classic.
- In 1993, best finish was a tie for fourth at the Itoki Hawaiian Ladies Open; played in only 15 events due to the birth of son Benjamin.
- In 1992, posted three top-10; including a season-best third place at the Los Coyotes LPGA Classic.
- In 1991, top finish was a tie for 12th at the Atlantic City Classic.
- In 1990, best finish was a tie for seventh at the Circle K LPGA Tucson Open; played a limited schedule due to the birth of her first child, son John Coyle.
- In 1989, top finish was a tie for 16th at the Mitsubishi Motors Ocean State Open.
- In 1988, best finish was a tie for eighth at the Ocean State Open.
- In 1987, returned to the LPGA Final Qualifying Tournament, where she tied for 39th to earn non-exempt status for the 1988 LPGA season.
- In 1986, best finish was 26th at the Rail Charity Classic; did not retain status for the 1987 LPGA season.
- In 1985, returned to the LPGA Final Qualifying Tournament, where she tied for 20th to earn exempt status for the 1986 LPGA season.
- In 1984, originally qualified for the Tour by tying for 45th at the LPGA Final Qualifying Tournament to earn non-exempt status for the 1985 LPGA season.

Amateur

In 1984, Redman won the National High School All-American Tournament and was named American Junior Golf Association Player of the Year and Girls Junior Player of the Year by *Golf Digest*. In addition, she captured the 1984 North and South Amateur Championship title.
