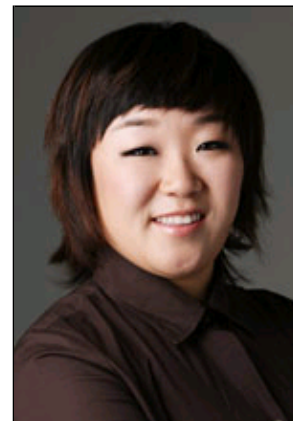

Professional

2010

- Won the Evian Masters Presented by Société Générale and the Mizuno Classic; tied for second at the CN Canadian Women's Open; finished third at the Sybase Match Play Championship; tied for third at the Kia Classic Presented by J Golf, the HSBC Women's Champions, LPGA Championship Presented by Wegmans and U.S. Women's Open; tied for fourth at the LPGA Hana Bank Championship Presented by SK telecom; tied for 5th place at the Kraft Nabisco Championship and the P&G NW Arkansas Championship Presented by Walmart; tied for sixth for Safeway Classic Presented by Coca-Cola and the SimeDarby LPGA Malaysia and tied for 14th at the RICOH Women's British Open.
- Won the KLPGA Championship, her 21st victory on the KLPGA, and qualified for the KLPGA Hall of Fame.
- Also won the CyberAgent Ladies on the JLPGA.
- Took over as Rolex Rankings No. 1 on July 26, 2010 (Ended August 16, 2010)

Career

- In 2009, earned Louise Suggs Rolex Rookie of the Year honors, mathematically eliminating the rest of the 2009 LPGA rookie class with three events remaining on the schedule; became the first South Korean to top the season-ending money list; became the season's first Rolex First-Time Winner with an eight-stroke, come-from-behind victory, the largest of the 2009 LPGA Tour season, at the HSBC Women's Champions, which was also her first official victory as a LPGA member; also won the P&G Beauty NW Arkansas Championship Presented by John Q. Hammons on the second hole of a sudden-death playoff, and the Wegmans LPGA, where she crossed the \$1 million mark in season and career earnings and earned the largest margin of victory on the 2009 LPGA Tour - seven strokes; carded a career-low 63 in the final round of the CN Canadian Women's Open, where she tied for 10th; won the Masters GC Ladies on the LPGA of Japan (JLPGA).
- In 2008, became the first non-LPGA member to win three events: the RICOH Women's British Open; Mizuno Classic; and season-ending ADT Championship, where she crossed the \$1 million mark in season earnings; carded three additional top-10 finishes in 10 official events; became the first player in Korea LPGA (KLPGA) history to complete the season Grand Slam, earning a 10-year exemption on the KLPGA; recorded seven KLPGA victories in 15 starts and seven additional top-eight finishes; won the PRGR Ladies Cup on the LPGA of Japan (JLPGA).
- In 2007, as a non-member, recorded three top-six finishes on the LPGA in eight starts, including a tie for third at the Evian Masters; recorded 16 top-five finishes in 18 starts on the KLPGA, including nine victories; after 33 career KLPGA events, broke the KLPGA career money record set by Il Mi Chung (99 events); also won the Thailand Ladies Open on the Ladies

Asian Golf Tour (LAGT).

- In 2006, competed on the KLPGA, earning Rookie and Player of the Year awards on the strength of three victories; was the first player in KLPGA history to record a sub-70 scoring average (69.72) and led the money list; also won once the LAGT.
- In 2005, won once as an amateur on the KLPGA, turned professional at the end of the year.

Amateur

Shin's amateur career included victories at the 2005 KLPGA SK Invitational, the Korea Women's Amateur Championship, Songam Amateur Championship, Korea Junior Championship and Korea Junior Championship as a member of the Korean National Team.
