- Finished fourth at the Sybase Match Play Championship; tied for fifth at the U.S. Women's Open, the RICOH Women's British Open and the Navistar LPGA Classic Presented by Monaco; finished 10th at the season-opening Honda PTT LPGA Thailand, where she recorded a career-low 65 in the third round; also tied for 11th place at the Kia Classic Presented by J Golf; tied for 14th at the Tres Marias Championship, LPGA Championship Presented by Wegmans and LPGA State Farm Classic; tied for 23rd at the Sime Darby LPGA Malaysia; tied for 24th at the HSBC Women's Champions; tied for 35th at the LPGA Hana Bank Championship Presented by SK telecom; tied for 40th at the CN Canadian Women's Open; tied for 45th at the Safeway Classic Presented by Coca-Cola and tied for 64th at the Evian Masters Presented by Société Générale.

Career

- In 2009, recorded a career-best tie for third at the CVS/pharmacy LPGA Challenge, where she carded a career-low 66 in the final round; tied for ninth at the McDonald's LPGA Championship Presented by Coca-Cola, her best finish at a major championship; carded her first LPGA career hole-in-one during the third round of the LPGA Corning Classic.
- In 2008, recorded a season-best tie for ninth at the Hana Bank * KOLON Championship 2008; competed on the Ladies European Tour (LET), winning the HypoVereinsbank Ladies German Open presented by Audi and the Scandinavian TPC hosted by Annika. Carded eight additional top-10 finishes and ended the year ranked fourth on the LET New Star Money List; returned to the LPGA Final Qualifying Tournament, where she finished runner-up to earn Priority List Category 11 for the 2009 LPGA season.
- In 2007, competed on the LET and recorded five top-20 finishes, including a fourth-place finish at the S4/C Wales Ladies Championship; tied for 54th at the LPGA Final Qualifying Tournament to earn non-exempt status for the 2008 LPGA season.
- In 2006, turned professional in October and competed on the Ladies European Tour, where she finished fourth at the Dubai Ladies Masters.

Amateur

Yang won the 2006 ANZ Ladies Masters on the Ladies European Tour (LET) as an amateur to become the youngest winner ever on the LET at 16 years, 9 months, 18 days. She was offered a special exemption to join the LET at the age of 17 and became the youngest member. Yang was also the youngest to win the Queensland Amateur Championship in 2005 and finished second at the 2006 Australian Junior Championship.
