WEATHER SYNOPSIS

We dodged some pretty decent size bullets over the last 48 hours and today will have to be no exception if we are to make it through the day unscathed. Surface trough of low pressure remains off to our east today helping to keep the area under a somewhat unsettled pattern. But first, starting off the morning once again with some low cloudiness and cool temperatures. But we can expect the low clouds to lift out by mid morning leaving us with partly cloudy skies. And just like the past couple of days, expect thunderstorms to begin to develop over the higher mountainous terrain by mid afternoon with the possibility of one or two of these storms developing near us here at the course and drifting over, as some rather high terrain is only about 10 miles to our southeast. Otherwise, expect highs today to reach into the lower 70s with winds out of the north to northeast about 10 to 15 by the afternoon. Skies will be more on the mostly cloudy side tonight with lows falling back into the middle 50s as low clouds redevelop over the area. Sunday appears to be almost similar to what we can expect today as the surface low will still persist keep that chance of a couple of thunderstorm in our forecast for the afternoon and evening hours.
