WEATHER SYNOPSIS

Expecting a rather pleasant spring day across the Franklin area today with a not so pleasant day in the forecast for tomorrow. But first, starting off with mainly sunny skies early this morning with temperatures in the middle 50s. Expecting skies to remain generally sunny today with some areas of high and mid level cloudiness moving in from the west later this afternoon. So will call it a mostly sunny to partly cloudy day in the forecast with highs reaching right around the 70-degree mark as high pressure centered to the north supplies a cool north wind. Skies become mostly cloudy tonight as the changes begin to occur. Low pressure moves out of the southern Mississippi River Valley and east across the southern Gulf Coast. This low will eject plenty to moisture into the area leading to widespread showers across the area for Sunday. Instability appears rather limited across our area tomorrow, so mainly just expecting the rain threat but will include the mention of an isolated thunderstorm or two. Temperatures will be held down in the upper 60s with the clouds and rain.
