## Amateur

Anschutz earned first-team American Junior Golf Association (AJGA) All-America honors. In 1981, she won the AJGA Tournament of Champions and the Hudson Junior Invitational. Anschutz was the 1984 British Amateur champion and a member of the U.S. Curtis Cup and World Cup teams during that same year. As a collegiate player at the University of Tulsa, she won seven tournaments and was the team's most valuable player in 1982 and 1984-85. She claimed runner-up honors at the 1982 and 1985 NCAA Championships and was a four-time All-American. She claimed semifinalist honors in the 1984 U.S. Women's Amateur after winning the 1983 Broadmoor Invitational. From 1983-85, prior to joining the LPGA, Anschutz made the cut in three U.S. Women's Opens and one Nabisco Dinah Shore. In 1984, she tied for 27<sup>th</sup> at the U.S. Women's Open and Columbia Savings Classic.

## Professional

### Career Highlights

- In 1997, tied for 13<sup>th</sup> at the ShopRite LPGA Classic, where she tied her career-low score of 66 during the final round.
- In 1996, best finish of the season was a tie for 29<sup>th</sup> at the LPGA Corning Classic.
- In 1995, best finish was a tie for 22<sup>nd</sup> at the First Bank Presents the Edina Realty LPGA Classic.
- In 1994, tied for 20<sup>th</sup> at the Minnesota LPGA Classic.
- In 1993, tied her career-low round of 66 on two occasions, second round of both the Sara Lee Classic and the Minnesota LPGA Classic; posted her best finish of the season in Minnesota, a tie for seventh.
- In 1992, recorded her first LPGA career hole-in-one during the first round of the LPGA Corning Classic; season-best finish was 12<sup>th</sup> place at the Sega Women's Championship.
- In 1991, best finish was a tie for second at the Northgate Computer Classic, where she lost to Cindy Rarick in a sudden-death playoff.
- In 1990, tied for sixth at the du Maurier Ltd. Classic, one of the LPGA's four major championships.
- In 1989, finished third at the Standard Register Turquoise Classic and tied her career-low round of 66 at the Crestar Classic.
- In 1988, had six top-10 finishes, including a tie for second at the Sarasota Classic.
- In 1987, captured the du Maurier Ltd. Classic title, one of the LPGA Tour's four majors, and originally posted her career-low score of 66 in the final round; also won the United Virginia Bank Golf Classic.
- In 1986, tied for second at both the United Virginia Bank Classic and MasterCard International Pro-Am and was named LPGA Rookie of the Year.
- In 1985, originally qualified for the LPGA Tour at the LPGA Final Qualifying Tournament, where she tied for 17<sup>th</sup> and earned exempt status for the 1986 season.

## Major Championship History

The U.S. Women's Open became an LPGA major in 1950; the McDonald's LPGA Championship Presented by AIG became a major in 1955; the Kraft Nabisco Championship became a major in 1983; and the Weetabix Women's British Open became a major championship in 2001. From 1979-2000 the LPGA's fourth major was the du Maurier Classic. The Weetabix Women's British Open replaced the du Maurier Classic in 2001.
