Professional

Career Highlights

- In 2000, best finish of the season was a tie for seventh at the LPGA Takefuji Classic.
- In 1999, tied for 21st at both the Longs Drugs Challenge and the Jamie Farr Kroger Classic; posted her first LPGA career hole-in-one during the second round of the Chick-fil-A Charity Championship.
- In 1998, best finish was a second place at the Cup Noodles Hawaiian Ladies Open, where she lost to Wendy Ward in a playoff.
- In 1997, season-best finish was a tie for fifth at the Friendly's Classic.
- In 1996, best finish was a tie for eighth at both the Oldsmobile Classic and the du Maurier Classic, one of the Tour's four majors.
- In 1995, tied for 18th at the du Maurier Ltd. Classic, one of the LPGA's four major championships; competed in just 17 events due to early-season maternity leave; her son William was born on March 11.
- In 1994, best finish was a tie for seventh at the Chrysler-Plymouth Tournament of Champions.
- In 1993, posted a career-low round with a 63 during the first round of the McCall's LPGA Classic at Stratton Mountain and went on to win the event, her second career title.
- In 1992, became a Rolex First-Time Winner by capturing the Las Vegas LPGA International title.
- In 1991, finished second in her first LPGA event, the Oldsmobile LPGA Classic.
- Prior to joining the LPGA Tour, competed on the Women Professional Golfers' European Tour (WPGET).

Amateur

Dormann was named the top junior golfer by *GOLF Magazine* in 1985. That same year, she won the U.S. Junior Girls and the Optimist Junior World titles and also finished second at the PGA National Junior. She played on the San Jose State University golf team, where she was a three-time All-American from 1986-88. She was a member of the 1987 NCAA Championship team.

Major Championship History

The U.S. Women's Open became an LPGA major in 1950; the McDonald's LPGA Championship Presented by AIG became a major in 1955; the Kraft Nabisco Championship became a major in 1983; and the Weetabix Women's British Open became a major championship in 2001. From 1979-2000 the LPGA's fourth major was the du Maurier Classic. The Weetabix Women's British Open replaced the du Maurier Classic in 2001.
