Career Highlights

- In 2001, played just two events due to illness.
- In 2000, missed the season after undergoing major surgery.
- In 1999, played in 15 events after having major surgery.
- In 1997, best finish was a tie for 14th at the Sara Lee Classic.
- In 1996, had major surgery in the spring and competed in 15 events prior to the operation.
- In 1995, top finish was a tie for 30th at the First Bank Presents the Edina Realty Classic.
- In 1994, best finish was a tie for 28th at the Nabisco Dinah Shore.
- In 1993, finished second at the Sara Lee Classic, where she posted a career-low 64 during the final round but lost to Meg Mallon on the third hole of a sudden-death playoff.
- In 1992, season-best finish was a tie for 28th at the Standard Register PING.
- In 1990, became a Rolex First-Time Winner at the Jamie Farr Toledo Classic.
- In 1989, played just five events due to the birth of her second child, Heidi, on Feb. 14.
- In 1988, her rookie season, best finish was a tie for 15th at the USX Golf Classic.
- In 1987, prior to joining the Tour, played the Women Professional Golfers' European Tour (WPGET) and the Futures Tour; gave birth to first daughter, Sarah, on March 4.

Amateur

Tombs won the New Hampshire Junior Golf Championship in 1979 and followed that with the New Hampshire State Championship in 1981. She captured the 1982 New England Amateur Championship title and in 1984 became the Eastern Amateur champion. Tombs was ranked among *Golf Digest's* top-10 amateur golfers in 1984. As a collegiate player at Arizona State University, she captured two tournament titles and was a two-time All-American.

Major Championship History

The U.S. Women's Open became an LPGA major in 1950; the McDonald's LPGA Championship Presented by AIG became a major in 1955; the Kraft Nabisco Championship became a major in 1983; and the Weetabix Women's British Open became a major championship in 2001. From 1979-2000 the LPGA's fourth major was the du Maurier Classic. The Weetabix Women's British Open replaced the du Maurier Classic in 2001.
