Career Highlights

- Became a Rolex First-Time Winner at the 2005 Jamie Farr Owens Corning Classic Presented by Kroger
- Tallied career-high nine top-10 finishes during the 2005 season
- In 2004, tied her career-low round of 65 in the third round of the Weetabix Women's British Open, where she finished third – her career-best finish in a major
- Selected as a captain's pick for the 2003 U.S. Solheim Cup Team, becoming only the third "rookie" in U.S. Team history. She finished the competition with a 0-3-0 record
- First carded her career-low 65 during the second round of the 2002 Longs Drugs Challenge. Matched the score two other times during that season
- Competed on the Symetra Tour in 1998 and 1999, finishing seventh on the Symetra Tour money list in '99 and posting two top-10 finishes in 14 events in '98
- At the University of Texas, was the 1997 NCAA individual champion, Big 12 champion and Big 12 Player of the Year
